Religious ASL Week

This week long program will focus on a variety of aspects of the Catholic Mass. In light of the new English Translation of the Roman Missal; this workshop should be very helpful.

We will explore the following:

^a Analyzing scripture in order to enhance interpreting the Sunday readings

^a Understanding and analyzing the prayers of the Catholic Mass i.e., Creed, Our Father, and the Eucharistic Prayer

^a Developing better voicing techniques when interpreting for Deaf lectors, priests, and deacons at Mass

^a Awareness of what Deaf Catholics want and need from the music portions of the Mass

^a Religious sign vocabulary

Putting abstract terms into ASL

Participants will have an enhanced understanding of the translation and interpreting process required to achieve a successful and theologically sound interpretation for Mass.

Participants will learn interpreting techniques and strategies and apply them in their own interpreting work.

Biographies of Instructors



H Before he became a priest, **Monsignor Glenn Nelson** received his Bachelor Degree from Northern Illinois University in 1987 in Deaf Education. He was a teacher and interpreter for the Deaf for 2 years

before deciding to become a priest and enter the seminary. Monsignor Nelson was ordained a priest in 1993 for the Diocese of Rockford, Illinois and was appointed director of the Deaf Apostolate for the diocese. Since Ordination, Msgr. Nelson has taught in a Catholic High School, served as Secretary to the Bishop, earned a License in Canon Law from the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, served his diocese as Chancellor, Vicar General, Moderator of the Curia and as Pastor of Christ the Teacher University Parish/Newman Catholic Student Center in DeKalb Illinois on the campus of Northern Illinois University. He has served the Deaf Catholic Community as a priest for over 18 years.

In 2001, Msgr. Nelson was elected to the Board of the National Catholic Office of the Deaf (NCOD) where he represents Region IV (Great Lakes Region) and has since been reelected to a third term. He currently serves NCOD as Vice President.



Deacon Patrick Graybill

received both his Bachelors and Masters Degree from Gallaudet University. After two years in Theological College at Catholic University, he joined the internationally acclaimed

National Theater of the Deaf for 10 years. In Rochester, New York, he enrolled in a permanent deaconate program and was ordained in 1982, while also working as a performing arts professor at the National Technical Institute for the Deaf.

From 1992 to 1996, he was producer and director for Sign Media, Inc. Then he returned to the National Technical Institute for the Deaf as Assistant Professor in the Department of Cultural and Creative Studies. He retired from the National Technical Institute for the Deaf on July 1, 2004. Deacon Graybill now travels the country to provide retreats for the Deaf Community in conjunction with ICDA.



Deacon David Sommers was ordained in 2000 after attending St. Francis Seminary in Milwaukee, WI from 1996-2000. Prior to that Deacon Sommers had received his Lay Ministry Formation Certificate from the Sacred

Heart School of Theology Seminary, Hales Corners, WI in 1992-95. His early formation included schooling at St. John School for the Deaf in Milwaukee and St. Rita's School for the Deaf in Cincinnati.

Deacon Sommers has been serving the Deaf Catholic Community for several years in many different capacities. He has a long history with the International Catholic Deaf Association (ICDA) and has served as president of the organization. As deacon, his ministry is widespread and he enjoys serving and working with the community. One of the many responsibilities he really enjoys is teaching ASL to members of the community.



Sue Gudenkauf is a freelance sign language interpreter in Madison, WI. She is RID nationally certified CT & CI. Sue has interpreted in post-secondary education, business, medical,

video relay, educational, and religious environments. Her passion lies mostly within Christian and Catholic settings. She has been a part of the National Catholic Office for Deaf Pastoral Week and Catholic Youth Week at the De Sales Center.

(Our RASL offers CEU credits for Registry of interpreters for the deaf (RID) members needing or wanting it.)
