**Advice for a young

Meet Jesus Christ in a personal way and develop a real, committed relationship with him. That is the only way we can discover the mind and heart of Christ, and what calling he desires for each of us. So, do those things that will bring you face-to-face with Christ: pray from the heart; receive the sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation frequently; pray some more; read the Sacred Scriptures; pray even more. Then, when the living God-Man chooses to reveal himself to you, and before even asking him what vocation he has in mind for you, say "yes" to whatever he has planned. At that point, you will be prepared for any vocation, whether it is the priesthood, religious life, or holy marriage.
